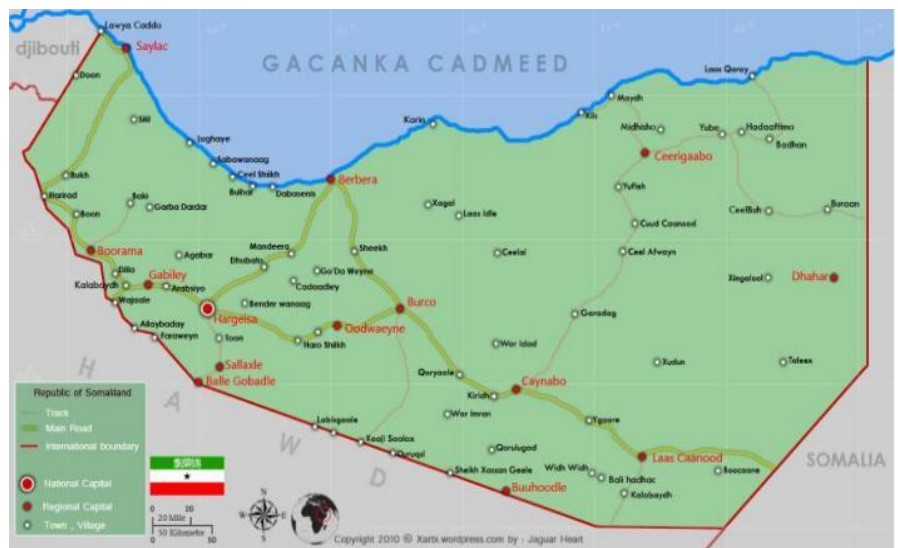
BVO advocates the availability of legal aid service for everyone.

To work closely with the local communities including women and children and the decision makers, to ensure positive socio-economic change and sustainable natural resource management.

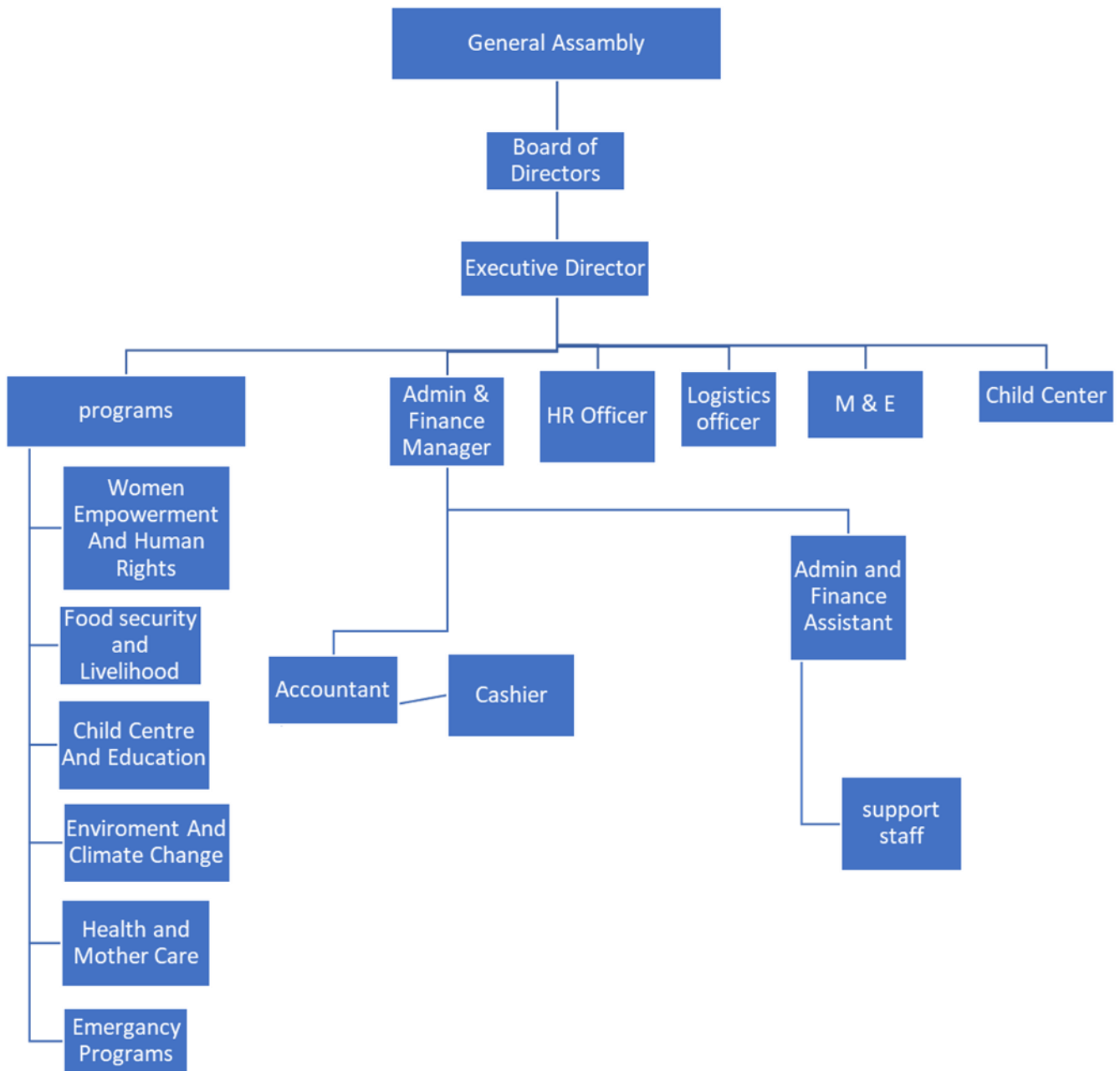

Fast-growing environmental challenges and climate change are imposing additional stress on the environment, and the livelihoods that depend on it. BVO has been implementing climate change, environmental protection, and livelihood programs in the country. BVO strives to find solutions for Somaliland's environmental challenges by planting indigenous tree species to serve as erosion controls, developing greenhouse enclosures for the nursery to protect the seedlings, advocating the use of efficient energy stoves, provision of knowledge and skills on climate-resilience, sustainable land and water management and natural resource conservation, enhance food security by promoting sustainable farming practices and Improving livelihoods by promoting renewable energy and green infrastructure.

Food security and proper livelihoods are not in good terms in most parts of Somaliland as people are suffering due to famines, hunger, and lack of basic necessities. Additionally, we pay special attention to the enhancement of food security and nutrition in many households who live with food insecurity in the remote areas of the country.

We also work on linking small beekeepers to honey value chain private companies to create a sustainable market base for their products. Furthermore, we provide capacity building and skill training to the farmers to maximize their production.
